
JUSTIFICATION FOR CRITERIA TO BE CONSIDERED AS GOOD PRACTICE

1. The action has been adequately disseminated among the beneficiaries, potential beneficiaries and the general public.

The Occupational Service for people with disabilities associated with a severe mental health diagnosis has been widely disseminated among beneficiaries, potential beneficiaries and the general public.

In this way, multiple resources have been developed in order to facilitate, to the greatest extent possible, access to information. Specifically, the dissemination of information has been carried out through various means:



These are just some of the many examples of dissemination actions that have been carried out and which help to make visible the great work developed in the Occupational Service for people with disabilities associated with a serious mental health diagnosis by the responsible entities. For all these reasons, it can be concluded that this dissemination criterion is fulfilled in a very wide and varied way, allowing a great outreach among the beneficiaries, potential beneficiaries and the general public.

2. The action incorporates innovative elements.

In relation to the innovative elements, the Occupational Service for people with disabilities associated with a diagnosis of serious mental health, incorporates several of them as can be summarized below:

- Development of legislative regulations, specifically Decree 7/2016 of 12 February, which regulates access to the occupational service for people with disabilities due to serious mental illness and the management of the waiting list for places in this service. Until that moment, no specific social services regulations were in place for people with mental health disabilities in the Balearic Islands.
- Implementation of a public network of occupational services for this group in the Island of Mallorca from 1 January 2017, non-existent until that moment, providing a response to the public responsibility to meet this need with services, human resources and technical resources.
- Wide territoriality available to facilitate the access to the service to any citizen of Mallorca who could be interested. The distribution of the entities that deal with the service covers the area of Palma, the area of Inca, the area of Manacor and the area of Calvià. Specifically, a large number of places have been developed, as this occupational service began in 2017 with 90 places and currently provides a total of 201.
- Mainstream intervention, coordination between services and specific follow-up, providing individual and personalized attention as well as group or global attention and, depending on the needs of the person, in as many areas as required, either psychosocial support, occupational area, or personal adjustment, training and work.
- Innovation and constant improvement of the professionals in charge of the service, establishing work synergies and methodological innovation in order to improve the

quality of care and service provided through qualified training, workshops, programs, alliances with other services and resources, commissions and professional actions or activities.

3. Adequacy of the results obtained to the objectives set.

The fundamental objective pursued by the Occupational Service for people with disabilities associated with a diagnosis of serious mental health is mainly of a social and occupational nature.

Specifically, this is a day care service that provides support to people with disabilities who have been diagnosed with a mental health disorder to a high degree because they need supervision, organization and assistance in the various activities of their daily lives and, in particular, support for the process of acquiring and developing basic and adaptive personal, social and pre-work skills so that they can achieve maximum socio-occupational integration.

In this way, the entities in charge of this Occupational Service, the Deixalles and Es Garrover foundations, and the Pro Salut Mental Estel de Llevant and Giral-Sol associations, carry out a global, interdisciplinary and integrating task with the intention of helping and supporting this underprivileged group which is developed according to the following principles:

- Assessment and evaluation of vulnerability and stress.
- Information and guidance as a model for recovery.
- o Planning of objectives and competencies to be achieved.
- Systemic model of intervention and support.
- Community model for evaluation and monitoring.

Therefore, it can be determined that the purpose of the Occupational Service is to provide comprehensive care to this group of people performing occupational tasks along with personal and social adjustments in search of maximum development of personal autonomy and social integration of them. All this under the maximum premise of allowing and enabling these people, according to their own capabilities, to acquire sufficient skills for their social and labor integration in a natural, family, social and professional context.

The added value of having received co-financing from the Balearic Islands' ESF OP over all these years should be highlighted, thanks to which it has been possible to improve and acquire different infrastructures, materials, hire staff, set up workshops and other resources that have been used to carry out this service. Consequently, and thanks to the extraordinary work and efficiency of the aforementioned entities, an average 59.40% of insertion results have been obtained by participants in the labour insertion itineraries in 2017, 77.46% in 2018 and 89.53% in 2019, which numerically reflects a very favourable progression in terms of professional integration achieved by the Occupational Service.

The results in terms of labour insertion added to those obtained thanks to the work of the activities and itineraries of social insertion, contribute to personal development, to the high level of satisfaction of the users and the social insertion of these individuals with disabilities associated to a diagnosis of serious mental health, which allows, consequently, to reach the objectives of the service that had been mentioned before. Therefore, it can be stated that this Occupational Service is achieving the established objectives.

4. Contribution to the resolution of a problem or weakness detected in the territorial scope of implementation.

The evolution of the data in the Balearic Islands shows a general increase in the group of people who have some kind of mental health problem. The reality is that these people are facing many difficulties and even, in some cases, the impossibility of achieving appropriate social and labour inclusion.

Faced with this scenario, the main problems endured by this group range from situations in their daily lives to the very development of basic and adaptive personal, social and work skills in order to achieve adequate social integration.

Once the aforementioned weakness was detected, the GOIB and, more specifically, the Directorate General for Care of the Dependency of the Ministry of Social Affairs and Sport launched the social concert for the Occupational Service for people with disabilities associated with a diagnosis of serious mental health. The entities in charge of carrying out the Service are working to improve accessibility and social and labour insertion of these people in a situation or risk of social exclusion, through their activation and integrated and personalised insertion itineraries. Thanks to the work of these abovementioned associations and foundations, very favourable results have been achieved in terms of the labour insertion of these people, as has been seen in the previous section.

In this way, the implementation of the Occupational Service contributes to the improvement of the employment situation and, therefore, the social and personal situation of the service's target audience, having a favourable impact on the whole of Balearic Islands society.

5. High degree of coverage of the target population.

In this area the data show very positive results, since between 2017 and 2019 the Occupational Service for people with disabilities associated with a diagnosis of serious mental health has received a total of 882 applications and care for 308 people in 2017, 378 in 2018 and 402 people in 2019.

In the three years mentioned, the Occupational Service has increased its capacity of available places from the 90 places agreed in 2017 to the 201 places agreed and cofinanced by the ESF in the island of Mallorca in 2019.

In addition, it is necessary to emphasize the wide territoriality available to facilitate access to the service to any citizen who is interested. The distribution of the entities that deal with this service covers the area of Palma, the area of Inca, the area of

Manacor and the area of Calvià, where the Associació Giral-Sol, the Fundació Es Garrover, the Associació Pro Salut Mental Estel de Llevant and the Fundació Deixalles are located respectively, showing from the beginning a strong commitment to territorialization, something fundamental in any service of a social and community nature.

In this way, we can affirm that this Occupational Service reaches a high level of coverage over the population to which it is addressed, guaranteeing the equality of the service in the whole territorial area of Mallorca, making possible the territorial equity and at the same time the decentralization of resources, the community intervention, and the free choice of service (as the Decree 7/2016 establishes).

6. Consideration of the horizontal criteria of equal opportunities and nondiscrimination, as well as social responsibility and environmental sustainability.

The different entities, associations and foundations in charge of the Occupational Service for people with disabilities associated with a serious mental health diagnosis follow equality plans to apply the principle of gender equality and non-discrimination in accordance with the horizontal criteria.

Specifically, in each activity, workshop, training or event carried out by the Occupational Service, the objective of raising awareness of gender equality, identifying behaviour that does not comply with the gender perspective and using inclusive language has been deeply taken into account.

Likewise, with regard to internal promotion and selection of staff, an equal distribution between men and women is used, regardless of race, gender, origin or culture.

On the other hand, all the workshops of the Occupational Service have a marked environmental line focused on sustainable development, in addition to the practical implementation of recycling in the different entities in charge of the service, the gradual implementation of electronic procedures to avoid the use of paper and the solar energy installations that some of the entities have.

7. Synergies with other policies or instruments of public intervention.

Finally, it should be taken into account that the co-financing of the Occupational Service for people with disabilities associated with a diagnosis of serious mental health through the ESF OP 2014-2020 of the Balearic Islands is completely related and should be understood as complementary to the Accompanying Service for people with a diagnosis of serious mental health of the Directorate General of Social Services for Dependency Care, also co-financed through the same ESF Operational Programme.

In this way, and thanks to the existing synergies between these two institutional actions on a regional level in the Autonomous Community of the Balearic Islands, it has been possible to help this group of people to develop their daily lives in the most integrated and standardised way possible on a social, family and work level. All of this reflects the CAIB's commitment to improving the accessibility of the most vulnerable people to health care, social services and guidance, training and education services, including the elimination of stereotypes.
